## *Web based ministry:*

After a long development cycle we are just about to launch the first of the foreign language sites. Added functionality is still being developed just to make it nicer but all of the necessary features are in place. We are now adding content to different language sites and focusing on the one which is nearly complete enough to use. Please pray!

Again, this is the most extensive, and has the greatest potential of any effort to get the Word of God to those who have never heard, which we have undertaken in our 38 years of missions. Trust the Lord with us for Souls who have never heard.

## *Video:*

We are working on pre-production; concept and script-writing for a couple of additional videos to be used with the abovementioned web outreach. These are specifically designed to draw people to content on the different language sites. We appreciate your intercession that God will direct and provide for these efforts.

## *Shipment:*

A 40' container of literature for Burma has just been delivered to our warehouse in Thailand. How we thank the Lord for His provision for the materials printed by brethren in the USA and for the shipping of the container.

We have mentioned in the past many of the printing ministries who provide this material for us. We appreciate each and every one of them. In fact, we do not even know many of the partners who work with those ministries!

This shipment however includes three pallets of material provided by a ministry at the Victory Baptist Church, Wichita Falls, TX. These dear folks have a small printing ministry in the church building. When they found out that we had published, but not yet printed en-mass several Burmese language projects over the years, they offered to print with their limited equipment.

Each week, several church members gathered to print, collate, trim and box these items; 4-book series of basic Bible studies, ABCs of Christian Growth, an illustrated 80page publication which was derived from a tract written by Adoniram Judson, and other items, all in Burmese. This was a huge undertaking by this ministry and again, it ended up being 3 pallets of materials not



yet printed except in small quantities. These brethren also paid for the paper, ink and etc.. Thank you Pastor Ricker and Victory Baptist Church!

Those materials are now staged in Thailand along with Gospels, and New Testaments in the Burmese and Falam Chin languages.
