However, we found many methods in which to make a difference. We will be able to tell you more soon as we formulate a plan concerning this matter. Meanwhile, let me say how much I appreciate your labor of love in praying for the sin-blighted souls on both sides of the border where we traveled. Keep on praying.

Update on Indochina Outreach:

Things are going along well with the printing of most of the materials for Indochina. We have experienced a setback however with one of the languages in the region. The difficulty has been with getting proofs fi-



nalized in the country. This has delayed the printing in this one major language and we finally made the decision to delay the shipment and our departure for the region. We now have plans to leave the USA in January, 2005. As soon as this was decided, we began to see the wisdom of it in several ways. I am glad to follow the Lord in even details such as departure dates.

Materials are now being printed in several of the other languages. Several small shipments have already arrived here in Fort Worth in preparation for the first container shipment. The above mentioned delay will allow us to do a more through job with publishing and gathering materials in the other languages.

Please keep this outreach in your prayers. Buddhists in these regional countries need to hear the Gospel. Pray that the materials we are working to publish will make a difference. In the next letter, I will list all of the different publications that have been prepared as well as the printing ministries that have provided the printing of these items. Pray for these ministries as they labor tirelessly and with little recognition for their sacrifice of time and money to get the work done.

Support:

Over the years the Lord has broadened our ministry and put before us several large projects. As this happened, brethren have caught the vision and provided funds for those special projects. We've never hesitated in going forward with even one of these situations due to funds: God has been faithful to raise up those who helped financially.

At the same time we have never actually had sufficient regular monthly support to do what we are doing. Again, the Lord has not left us to do without in any manner: He raised up folks to step in the gap when there was a need. We had no idea that we would ever find ourselves in the middle of so many opportunities to make a difference in



so many situations. I could have never anticipated how much it would have cost even if the Lord had shown us the opportunities ahead of time. Now that we know however, we feel it necessary to ask prayer as we seek additional support. Several churches have already taken us on for support in the past year, but we still need to add around \$1,000 per month to our work fund. Please pray in this direction on our behalf.

The extra time before we depart for Thailand will be spent in visiting

churches in several states. I will be in WA, PA, IN, KY, OH, and Texas in the month of November. Please pray for these meetings.

Personal news:

Our Daughter's family (Brian and Lisa Johnson) arrived from Lithuania on September 2nd, two days after I arrived back in Fort Worth from China. We enjoyed nearly three weeks with them including a trip to Louisiana to attend a Gaudet Family reunion. More than a few tears were shed when they loaded our three grandkids in the van and headed out for their first meeting during their furlough.

Barely 5 days later, they learned that Brian's mother was near death and they drove straight through from Arkansas to Wisconsin to be with her. They were able to make it to her bedside before she died. Krinny and I flew to Superior, Wisconsin to attend the funeral on October 2.

All these things happen in missionaries' families just like in yours. Thank you for allowing us space to experience these things. We are just folks like you.

Thank you for your partnership with us in this work. We simply could not be in this work without your help in intercession and support.


