When we left Thailand on this trip to the USA we were on hold with shipping nearly 80,000# of Scriptures into Burma. The hold-up was due to lack of funds. Just before we left, we had produced a video outlining the whole situation concerning the need in Burma. We wish to report to you that the funds have been given as well as enough to take care of at least two other shipments, Praise the Lord!

Additionally, we want to report that all of the Bibles, New Testaments, and gospels which we had in storage in Thailand have now made it to the distribution point inside Burma. We thank God for our co-workers and fellow missionaries who stepped in and handled all this while we are in the USA.

Another 40' shipping container is on the ocean as this is written. We just stand in amazement as to what the Lord has done. This container marks the 8th 40,000# shipment of Burmese scriptures. This does not count a number of shipments we have handled on behalf of other brethren. In fact, we have committed to help 4 other ministries ship literature to their contacts in the country.

It is exciting to see all this focus on Burma now that things have begun to open up. Please pray for the brethren there to continue to have freedom to minister and boldness to take advantage of the opportunity. Pray for several important translation and publishing efforts in languages of Burma which are underway as this is written.

We have just been contacted by a dear brother in India who plans to undertake a translation of the New Testament into his language. It is a unique situation and God has prepared him for it. Please pray as we consider how we may be able to help with that effort.

Trip to Mexico



In early June I had the opportunity to be part of the 50th anniversary celebration of the ministry of Milton Martin in Chiapas, Mexico. What an experience it was to be among hundreds of people who looked to this man as their spiritual father. Contingents from nearly

100 of the churches which have been established took part in the celebration. Let no one say that the work of missions is a thing of the past. It certainly is very real to these people.

I found one of my own pictures behind a dresser. I put it back up where it belonged. Almost everything left is something I will keep even if it was not mine to start with. Now things feel like home. My home. Praise the Lord for a place to call home, even if it is only an earthly home and not permanent in the heavenlies. (Note from Tom – Who knows, I might have put that picture behind the dresser! Same for the peanuts... ;-))

Our Pakistani friends, Asim and Tina, have made our home church theirs and are assimilating so well, we couldn't be happier for them. Our church is the most loving and accepting place for anyone who comes to us. They made Asim and Tina welcome from the very first and are helping them in every way to adjust in their new homeland, and into a new and sometimes daunting culture.

Please pray for Tom and me. We are both battling health issues and are getting older and less physically functional every year. We realize now more than ever that without the prayers of God's people, we can do nothing
